Join the N.H. Fish and Game Watershed Education Program (WEP) and the USFS Hubbard Brook Experimental Forest to explore the aquatic wonders of the 8,000 acre temperate forested Hubbard Brook watershed.

Participants will:

- Learn about climate change watershed science from USFS researchers
- Obtain curriculum activities from the Hubbard Brook Research Foundation developed by classroom teachers
- Understand the impacts of climate change in Mirror Lake with the *invasion of the pumpkinseed* study by a Plymouth State graduate student
- Learn how to use the NHF&G WEP protocols to
 - Collect water quality and macroinvertebrate data from a local stream
 - Study fish populations by electro-fishing with biologists
 - Study the local watershed and address the impact of climate change on brook trout populations
 - $\circ~$ Use ArcGIS Online (AGO) technology in the classroom
 - To post, share and analyze watershed data
 - To design Story Maps to share outdoor adventures
- Learn AGO from other classroom teachers and natural resource & GIS specialists (NHEdGIS team)
